### REACHING THE UNREACHED

Dear Friends,

Just a quick update on our activities here. On Tuesday, in addition to speaking at the workshop for pastors during the day and the widows group in the afternoon, I was asked back to the Assemblies of God church where I had spoken the night before. I did not have a chance to finish the Master Builder Plan there because I had to go through an interpreter. The pastor there liked the presentation so well he asked me to come back the next night to finish it, though that had not at first been scheduled. Today we drove to Mangu, a city about an hour north of Jos. It has a population of about 500,000. I was speaking at a conference for about 200 pastors that belong to CAN (Christian Association of Nigeria). There were representatives from every denomination in that region, including Catholics and Anglicans. Again, Apostle Godson and Pastor Maji, our hosts, stated that they are getting very good feedback from the pastors. Today I shared the Master Builder Plan to set the stage for doing part of the Mission Mandate Training tomorrow. Mangu, though located in the north, is an isolated area that has many Christians in a sea of surrounding Muslims. They are strategically located to penetrate the Unreached tribes in the north. Please cover them in prayer that they will be able to assimilate this information and make disciples among each of these Unreached tribes.

Paul, Janine, and Hannah are doing exceptionally well. They are performing musical numbers at all the events, as well as sharing their testimonies. There is such harmony among them. They have positively endeared themselves to all my African friends by keeping everyone laughing nonstop. The pastor at the Assemblies church we spoke at was trying to keep us in Africa by providing Nigerian husbands for Janine and Hannah, a Nigerian wife for Paul, and by naming his new church building after me. We politely declined!

We trust you are all doing well. Please keep us in prayer this weekend. The young people will be sharing at a youth rally.
