



Estimated Cost

The Estimated Cost per person for this trip will vary based on airfare and whether or not some of the items listed below are needed. Some people may already have a passport, shots, and need little to no spending money. These types of expenses cause the price to fluctuate from person to person. **Please note that time is an issue in obtaining Passports, Visas and Immunizations. These should be obtained as soon as possible, or you will not be allowed entry into Kenya.**

3. Tourist Visa (Kenya-Single Entry)	\$50.00
4. Immunizations Check with your local Health Department for a list of the shots required for travel to Kenya. You will also need Anti-Malaria medicine.	\$100.00 - \$300.00
5. Airfare (Round Trip) (These are Estimated Costs)	\$1,500.00-\$2,500.00
6. Airport Departure Tax (Not payable in local currency)	\$ 20.00 per Person
7. Lodging	\$600.00 - \$800.00

• Treetops Resort – One Night	
8. Meals Allow for at least \$30.00 per day for ten (10) days.	\$300.00+
9. Ground Transportation Ground transportation cost is for the entire trip (or ten to eleven days) and depends on local rates.	\$225.00 - \$450.00
10. Church Offering Come with the intent of being a blessing. We suggest an offering of least \$20.00 U.S. Dollars per church service.	\$100.00+
11. Money for Spending & Incidentals Best if carried in \$100 dollar bills.	\$100.00 - \$300.00

Note: If you already have a Passport and your Shots are up to date, you can exclude these line items. Also, if you are a “Big Spender” you should budget more for spending money and incidental expenses. The hotel has an excellent restaurant and we are close to several other good places to eat. There are fast food places but they are not quite like America. The churches will provide some meals, but expect to eat in restaurants for most meals. Rooms can be shared so that the cost can be kept within a reasonable limit.
